*Improvements to the elementary school include:*

- 1 Classroom Addition**  
Ten classroom addition with additional special education and support space.
- 2 Elementary Bus Loop Improvements**  
Reconfiguration of bus loop, parent pick-up/drop off lane, and additional parking spaces
- 3 Cafeteria & Library Reconfiguration**  
Renovate existing library into dedicated cafeteria space, renovate existing administrative offices into library
- 4 Security Improvements**  
New administrative office addition with visitor access control
- 5 Site Utility Improvements**  
Infrastructure upgrades including sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and water service to the elementary school building.

### 1 Classroom Addition

Additional classroom spaces will eliminate need for portable classroom buildings, add space to bring 6th grade back to the elementary building (currently at middle school), provide additional classroom space to accommodate our current needs as well as future student enrollment growth at Pleasantville Elementary

### 2 Elementary Bus Loop Improvements

A revamped bus drop-off and pick up lane will be safer by eliminating the need for students to cross Jones Street to board the buses and a smoother process for parents to pick up their child in the pick up lane. This would also provide additional parking space at Pleasantville Elementary.

### 3 Cafeteria & Library Reconfiguration

The current gymnasium doubles as cafeteria space, negatively impacting the physical education curriculum. A dedicated cafeteria space would allow greater flexibility in scheduling lunch periods and physical education classes.

### 4 Security Improvements

Relocating the administrative offices to the front entrance will better manage daily access of visitors to the school building, keeping students and staff safer.

### 5 Site Utility Improvements

Aging infrastructure will be replaced and upgraded as necessary for the above mentioned projects. Additional fire hydrants will be allocated around the building to better assist the fire department in an emergency situation.
